

COMMUNITY NEED AND PROGRAM IMPACT

Purpose of the Program

Rosetta Family Foundation is a nonprofit organization developing a new six-bed Adult Residential Facility in Los Angeles for adults with developmental disabilities. The proposed program is designed to provide twenty-four hour non-medical residential care and supervision in a safe, stable, community-based home for adults whose needs can be appropriately met in a structured residential setting.

The purpose of the program is to expand access to safe residential support for adults who require supervision, assistance with daily living, and a consistent home environment, but who do not require institutional care. The program is being developed to support dignity, stability, quality of life, and community-based living within the approved scope of an Adult Residential Facility.

Community Need

There is an ongoing need for safe, community-based residential homes for adults with developmental disabilities who require supervision and daily living support. Many adults who need structure, consistent oversight, and assistance with everyday routines cannot safely live independently, yet do not require a higher level of medical or institutional placement.

Limited availability of appropriate residential settings can contribute to instability, unsafe living arrangements, or placement in environments that do not reflect the individual's support needs. Small residential homes can provide an appropriate alternative for adults whose needs can be safely met in a supervised, non-medical setting.

Rosetta Family Foundation is developing this program to help address that need in Los Angeles through a six-bed residential model focused on safety, supervision, and community-based living.

Program Model

The proposed program is being developed as a six-bed Adult Residential Facility intended to serve adults with developmental disabilities in a small residential setting.

The program is designed to provide:

- safe and stable housing

- supervision for safety
- assistance with activities of daily living
- structured daily routines
- medication assistance as permitted by regulation
- coordination with authorized service providers
- a community-based residential environment

Future admissions will occur only after required approvals, screening, and program opening. Residents will be admitted only if their needs can be safely met within the approved service model, staffing structure, and non-medical scope of care.

The program is not designed to provide skilled nursing care, locked supervision, detoxification services, or correctional placement.

Anticipated Program Impact

A well-prepared residential program can help provide stability for adults with developmental disabilities who require supervision and support in daily living. The anticipated impact of the program includes:

- improved residential stability
- safe community-based living
- reduced risk of unsafe or inappropriate placement
- consistent supervision and support
- support for daily living functioning
- increased stability within a structured home setting
- long-term residential support in a respectful environment

By developing a small, supervised residential home, Rosetta Family Foundation seeks to expand access to safe and appropriate housing for adults whose needs can be met in a community-based setting.

Use of Grant and Community Support

Grant funding and community support will help Rosetta Family Foundation prepare for the responsible opening of a new six-bed Adult Residential Facility in Los Angeles.

Funding may support:

- residential home preparation
- beds, furnishings, and household equipment
- safety and accessibility improvements
- fire and life-safety readiness
- staff training and preparation
- program development costs
- resident support supplies
- required licensing and compliance expenses
- core operating infrastructure

All funds will be used solely for lawful charitable purposes in accordance with nonprofit and applicable residential care requirements.

Commitment to Responsible Development

Rosetta Family Foundation is committed to developing a residential program grounded in safety, dignity, accountability, and responsible preparation. The organization is preparing written policies, staff training procedures, safety plans, administrative systems, and program oversight measures needed to support consistent and compliant residential operations.

The Foundation is also committed to responsible stewardship of funding and to developing a safe, stable, community-based residential home for adults with developmental disabilities whose needs can be appropriately met within the program model.
