Program Overview

Rosetta Family Foundation is developing a six-bed Adult Residential Facility in Los Angeles for adults with developmental disabilities. The proposed program is designed to provide twenty-four hour non-medical residential care and supervision in a safe, stable, community-based home for adults whose needs can be appropriately met in a structured residential setting.

The purpose of the program is to provide safe housing, consistent supervision, daily living support, and long-term residential stability within the approved scope of an Adult Residential Facility. The program is being developed in alignment with applicable residential care requirements and the facility's planned operating model.

Population Served

The proposed residential program is intended to serve adults age eighteen and older with developmental disabilities who require non-medical supervision and assistance with daily living.

Individuals appropriate for the program may need:

- supervision for safety
- assistance with activities of daily living
- structured daily routines
- support with personal care
- medication assistance as permitted
- support with community participation

Residents must be appropriate for placement in a small residential home and must have needs that can be safely met within the program's staffing structure and approved service model.

Residential Services

The proposed program is designed to provide residential services in a supervised home environment with trained staff available to support residents throughout the day.

Services may include:

- twenty-four hour supervision

- assistance with daily living activities
- support with personal care routines
- medication assistance as permitted
- meal preparation and nutrition support
- laundry and housekeeping assistance
- transportation coordination
- support with appointments
- coordination with Regional Center and other authorized service providers
- structured daily routines
- community participation support

Services will be provided according to individual resident needs and within the approved scope of the facility's license and program design.

Home Environment

The proposed program is being developed in a small, community-based residential setting intended to provide a safe and comfortable home environment.

The home may include:

- shared or private bedrooms
- common living areas
- kitchen and dining space
- bathroom facilities
- outdoor space when available
- safety equipment as required
- supervision by trained staff

The goal is to maintain a home-like setting that supports stability, dignity, safety, and structured daily living while meeting applicable residential care and safety requirements.

Admission and Placement

Future placement in the residential program will occur only after review of available information to determine whether the program is appropriate for the individual.

Potential referrals may come from:

- Regional Centers
- authorized placement sources
- responsible family members
- service coordinators
- other authorized sources

Before admission, the program will review available information to confirm that:

- the individual meets admission criteria
- the individual's needs are within program scope

- the home can safely provide the required supervision
- the placement is compatible with other residents
- staffing and support needs can be appropriately met

Admission will occur only when the program determines that the individual's needs can be safely met within the approved service model.

Program Safety and Supervision

Rosetta Family Foundation is committed to developing a residential program that prioritizes resident health, safety, dignity, and consistent supervision.

Program safety measures are intended to include:

- trained staff supervision
- background clearance requirements
- written policies and procedures
- emergency and disaster plans
- medication procedures
- incident reporting procedures
- resident rights protections
- health and safety standards
- fire and life-safety compliance

These measures are intended to support a safe and stable residential environment and to promote responsible program operation.

Commitment to Quality Residential Care

Rosetta Family Foundation is committed to developing a residential program that provides safe, respectful, and responsible non-medical care for adults with developmental disabilities.

The program is being developed in alignment with:

- nonprofit requirements
- residential care licensing requirements
- approved program plans
- written policies and procedures
- health and safety standards

The Foundation will maintain documentation, staff preparation, administrative oversight, and compliance-focused procedures to support safe and consistent residential operations upon program opening. The goal of the program is to provide long-term residential stability in a safe, supervised, community-based home.
